Attachment IV.B.1.c Equitable Treatment of Customer Classes

Table IV.B.1.c identifies the Plan elements for which there may be variances in the treatment between customer classes or subclasses. Those variances in treatment are described below.

Medium/Large commercial and industrial customers enrolling in the Program after Program launch may be offered a market-based price rather than the contract price. Such differential treatment is equitable because these customers have more choices in the marketplace and impose greater costs on the Program than other customers when they join after Program launch.

Customers that previously opted out and later wish to re-enroll in the Program may be offered a market-based price. This differential treatment is equitable because these customers previously made a choice not to participate in the Program and as a result their load was no longer planned for by the electricity supplier.

December 29, 2023

Dear Chelmsford Electricity Service Customer,

I am writing today with information regarding your electric bill. The Town of Chelmsford has a group electricity buying program called Chelmsford Choice. The program offers long-term, stable prices, consumer protections, and the potential for savings (though savings cannot be guaranteed), while supporting Chelmsford's sustainability efforts.

If you received this letter and you do nothing, you will be AUTOMATICALLY enrolled in Chelmsford Choice, which is in accordance with state law.

Participation is not required. Your opt-out request must be made or postmarked by January 31, 2024, to avoid automatic enrollment.

If you choose to participate, you will remain a National Grid customer, but Dynegy will be listed on your bill as your electricity supplier, and the Chelmsford Choice price will be used to calculate the Supply Services portion of your bill. Nothing else will change:

- Your electric bill will continue to come from National Grid, and you will continue to send payments to National Grid. You will not receive a second electric bill with participation.
- You will continue to call National Grid if your power goes out.
- If you are on a budget plan or are eligible for a low-income discount or fuel assistance, you will continue to receive those benefits.

If you choose not to participate, the Supply Services portion of your bill will continue to be calculated based on National Grid's Basic Service price, as it is now.

Benefits to You

Price stability - Chelmsford Choice prices are fixed until November 2025. Long-term price stability makes Chelmsford Choice different from National Grid's Basic Service, which you have now. Basic Service prices change seasonally. Price stability also makes the program different from many electricity supply offers in the marketplace.

New choices - You have three options in the program:

- Chelmsford Choice Basic provides the minimum amount of renewable electricity required by law. You will be automatically enrolled in Chelmsford Choice Basic.
- Chelmsford Choice Greener provides 64% of your electricity from new renewable energy projects in the New England region and is available by request.
- Chelmsford Choice Greenest provides all (100%) of your electricity from new renewable energy projects in the New England region and is available by request.

Potential savings - Chelmsford Choice offers the potential for savings compared with National Grid's Basic Service prices. However, because National Grid's prices change and their future prices are not known, **Chelmsford Choice cannot guarantee to provide savings over the term of the contract with Dynegy.**

Chelmsford Choice program prices include a \$0.001 / kWh administrative fee. Program prices could increase as a result of a change in law that results in a direct, material increase in costs during the term of the electricity supply agreement.

** The Commonwealth of Massachusetts requires that all electricity supply products include a minimum of 62% from clean or renewable energy resources in 2024 and 63% in 2025, which includes electricity from MA Class I renewable energy projects and also from other clean or renewable sources such as nuclear and trash-to-energy. Chelmsford Choice Basic meets the minimum requirement. Chelmsford Choice Greener and Chelmsford Choice Greenest exceed it by including additional electricity from MA Class I renewable energy projects.

Frequently Asked Questions

I have received this letter, and also I have recently signed a contract with an electricity supplier. What should I do? You may have signed your contract after this mailing list was created. In that case, you must opt out if you wish to retain your current contract. If you do not opt out, your account will be enrolled in the program, which may trigger early termination fees from your electricity supplier.

I have solar panels on my property or I participate in a community solar program. If I join Chelmsford Choice, will I continue to receive the credits or payments that I receive now? Yes. You will continue to receive solar credits and/or solar incentive payments, and participating in Chelmsford Choice will not change how they are calculated.

I have a tax-exempt account. How can I retain my account's tax-exempt status? Taxes will be billed as part of the program's power supply charge. Customers are responsible for identifying and requesting an exemption from the collection of any tax by providing appropriate tax-exemption documentation to Dynegy. This notice contains important information about a price change on your National Grid electric bill.

Your electricity account is enrolled in Chelmsford Choice, the Town's electricity program. The program gives you a Chelmsford price for the Supply Services portion of your National Grid electric bill. You are enrolled in the Basic option, which means you receive the lowest price available through the program.

Chelmsford currently has a contract with Constellation to supply electricity to Chelmsford Choice participants. That contract will expire in November of this year, and a new, 24-month contract with Dynegy will go into effect. **The new contract will bring new prices.**

The Constellation contract was signed in 2020 and has kept our prices low. However, electricity supply prices have risen significantly since then because of volatility in global energy markets. Chelmsford Choice prices will move to market levels when the Dynegy contract takes effect.

Your new Chelmsford Choice price: 14.843 ¢/kWh

The new price is fixed for 24 months, from November 2023 - November 2025.

Your new electricity supply price will be higher than your current price, but it will be **lower** than National Grid's winter residential Basic Service price of 18.213 ¢/kWh, which will take effect on November 1. *Please note that because National Grid's prices change and future prices are not known, future savings compared with National Grid's prices cannot be guaranteed.*

Your choices:

- Take no action and remain in Chelmsford Choice. If you wish to continue participating in Chelmsford Choice in the Basic option, no action is required. Your enrollment will renew automatically at 14.843 ¢/kWh in November 2023. You will first see the new price on your National Grid electric bill in December 2023.

Supply and Renewable Content

The Supply and Renewable Content rate component covers the cost of the products and services necessary to provide firm power supply to program participants, including:

- electrical energy;
- capacity;
- reserves;
- ancillary services;
- transmission services;
- the cost of distribution system losses; and
- congestion management.

This rate component also covers the cost of Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs), including:

- the RECs needed to meet the requirements of state law; and
- the additional RECs specified by the town.

Consultant Services

The Consultant Services rate component covers the costs of administering the program, including:

- representing the Town before the Department of Public Utilities, including securing regulatory approvals and maintaining regulatory compliance;
- conducting procurements for electricity supply as needed;
- providing customer support by telephone and email;
- providing public education, including through in-person events, printed communications (signs, banners, brochures), electronic communications (video, slides), and social media;
- developing and maintaining a comprehensive, branded program website, including ongoing updates to ensure regulatory compliance;

- receiving customer requests to enroll, change program options, or opt-out; forwarding those requests to the electricity supplier; and monitoring implementation;
- overseeing periodic automatic-enrollment mailings to new customers;
- monitoring electricity supplier performance;
- monitoring electricity market and regulatory developments; and
- preparing reports to the Department of Public Utilities and the town.
